OBJECTIVE

The objective of this project is to develop a Resettlement and Livelihood Restoration Framework for the oil and gas sector to be applied in upstream and midstream (crude oil pipeline) sectors. The Framework will set out the principles and procedures to be followed where any works in upstream and midstream (crude pipeline) are expected to result in physical or economic displacement due to land acquisition or restrictions to access of use of natural resources.

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR) Resettlement and Livelihood Restoration Framework

Date: 18th February 2025

1. Background Information

The State Department for Petroleum was established by the Executive Order No. 1 of 2023 on Organization of the Government of the Republic of Kenya as one of the two State Departments under the Ministry of Energy and Petroleum. The State Department is mandated to develop and implement policies that create an enabling environment for efficient operation and growth of Kenya's petroleum sector. The Ministry sets strategic direction to facilitate the growth of the sector while providing long term vision for all sector players.

Specifically, the State Department for Petroleum, has the responsibility to initiate, develop, and review policies, strategies and programs in the oil and gas sector. It also provides guidance on legal and regulatory framework for spearheading upstream and mid/downstream petroleum operations.

Petroleum development has a long history in Kenya. The importation of petroleum products into the country began in the early 1900s while petroleum exploration dates to the 1950s. However, the first commercially viable oil discovery was made in 2012 in the Tertiary Rift, followed by significant gas discoveries in the offshore Lamu Basin and onshore Anza Basin. The Government together with the International Oil Companies (IOC's) are keen to commercialize the Tertiary Rift discoveries in Block 10BB and 13T and has initiated the process of field development review and approval. Upon approval, intense project implementation activities will commence which include construction of upstream and midstream facilities. The State Department therefore needs the necessary tools, policies and guidelines to enable it to prepare for the anticipated land acquisition and resettlement activities that will result from the project implementation. The Resettlement and Livelihood Restoration Framework is expected to reduce any adverse impacts associated with physical or economic displacement, and to ensure arrangements are in place to mitigate the adverse impacts that may occur. The consultant will take into consideration existing laws and regulations in the country while developing the Framework.

The Framework will ensure that there is a systematic process for the different stages of the implementation that assures participation of affected persons, involvement of relevant institutions and stakeholders, adherence to Government procedures and requirements, and outline compensation for affected persons. The Framework is expected to address acquisition of land, relocation or loss of shelter, loss of assets or access to assets, possible displacement and associated impacts within the core zones and wider catchment area, as future private or public investments are made in the extractive industry and especially oil and gas sector in Kenya.

The Framework will define roles, responsibilities, procedures, and compensation eligibility of the affected persons and determination of compensation entitlements to guide the preparation of the site-specific Resettlement Action Plans (RAPs) during implementation

of site-specific projects that may cause involuntary displacement due to compulsory acquisition of land owned by communities and individuals.

2. Objectives of the Assignment

The objective of this project is to develop a Resettlement and Livelihood Restoration Framework for the oil and gas sector to be applied in upstream and midstream (crude oil pipeline) sectors. The Framework will set out the principles and procedures to be followed where any works in upstream and midstream (crude pipeline) are expected to result in physical or economic displacement due to land acquisition or restrictions to access of use of natural resources.

3. Scope of the Assignment

The consultant is expected to develop a Resettlement and Livelihood Restoration Framework for the State Department for Petroleum.

The specific scope of the assignment includes:

- Review of existing and relevant legal, regulatory and policy frameworks guiding the petroleum sector. This will include Kenyan laws on land acquisition, resettlement and compensation.
- ii. Review of existing petroleum related information on project design and social linkages including the land requirement for the affected areas.
- iii. Undertake stakeholder identification, analysis and mapping in the oil and gas sector as well as provide various incentives for the stakeholders.
- iv. Undertake field survey in selected areas where oil and gas development may occur and document relevant socio-economic data. This data will include population, land coverage, economic activities in oil & gas extractive activities.
- v. Undertake a socio-economic survey in the areas with high potential for resettlement, including both the core zones and the adjacent areas. This is to assist in defining the content of the Framework. This should include a preliminary identification of existing land tenure conflicts and/or patterns of conflict in the project areas and how such conflicts are being resolved, as well as any changes in land use or livelihoods which have occurred in recent years, including any population influx.
- vi. Provide a template for the minimum requirements for a resettlement action plan (RAP) to the client.
- vii. Provide guidance on institutional arrangement and responsibilities in the development of RAP in upstream and midstream (crude oil pipeline) levels of the projects.

- viii. Develop monitoring and evaluation criteria for RAP in upstream and midstream sector, specifically if a RAP is to be implemented, including completion of a baseline socioeconomic survey and follow up surveys of Project Affected Persons (PAPs) and host communities.
- ix. Provide an in-depth analysis of available compensation alternatives and propose methods of valuing affected assets.
- x. Develop guidelines for commissioning, monitoring and decommissioning of RAP.
- xi. Develop grievance redress mechanism in accordance with International Best Practices. The consultant should describe the process of resolving disputes relating to resource use restrictions that may arise between or among affected communities, and grievances that may arise from members of communities who are dissatisfied with the eligibility criteria, community planning measures, or actual implementation.
- xii. Develop eligibility criteria for defining various categories of displaced persons.
- xiii. Arrangements for monitoring of resettlement initiatives by the implementing agency and, if required, by independent monitors.

4. Reporting Obligations

The consultant will develop all the reports in English and will provide soft and final hard copies (3) bound to the State Department for Petroleum.

The reports will be reviewed and approved by the State Department for Petroleum.

5. Duration of Task

The consultancy project shall be for a period of twenty-four (24) weeks [six (6) months] from effective date.
